

Piedmont Technical College Presidential Ambassador Information Sheet

Overview

The Presidential Ambassadors are a select group of second year students who are chosen to represent the president, the college and their program of study. These students are selected on the basis of their academic achievement, college and community involvement, leadership skills and potential and a willingness to give service to the college. Students are selected to provide a broad picture of the “typical” PTC student.

Criteria

To be eligible to serve as a Presidential Ambassador, a student must:

- Be in good academic standing
- Be enrolled in at least 6.0 credit hours in fall and spring semesters
- Must not complete studies earlier than May 2015
- Submit the Presidential Ambassador application, including the student statement
- Provide a recommendation form from a faculty member, within the student’s major
- Attend an information session
- Participate in the selection process
- If selected, participate in summer training and monthly meetings

Typical activities for Presidential Ambassadors

Some activities that Presidential Ambassadors have participated in include:

- New Student Orientations
- Campus Tours
- College Events – Transfer Fair, Employers Day, Student Life events
- Graduation Ushers
- Legislative BBQ
- Photo shoots and videos for Marketing
- Student Assistance – ID cards and schedules
- Presentations to small and large groups
